Louis Knoche Dead

Louis Knoche, who, for the past forty-five years, has lived on the farm, two miles west of Paola, died last Saturday from heart failure. He had been ill for several weeks. Mr. Knoche was one of the oldest settlers in this vicinity. He came to America from his birth place in Wunderhausen, Westfalen, Germany, in 1854, and in 1861 he located at the home place, where he died. Soon after coming to Miami county he married to Amelia Homrighausen, who with a son, John, one brother, James, and two sisters, Mrs. Elizabeth Heinselman, of San Francisco, and Katherine Knoche, of Martin City, Mo., survive him.

Mr. Knoche was 77 years, 4 months, and twenty-eight days old at the time of his death. Interment was made in Oak Grove cemetery Monday afternoon. Reverend Sherman Hill officiated.
