

George Knoche, Sr., is Called.

After a lingering illness of several months, George Knoche Sr., one of our most respected and influential farmers, passed away at his home southwest of town Saturday morning, February 5th, at 12:30. "Uncle" George was one of those fine, upright men who make a community better for having lived in it, a man whose word was as good as gold and whose friends were numbered by his acquaintances. His death has taken a provident and loving husband and father, a kind neighbor and a much loved citizen from our midst.

The funeral services were held at the home Monday afternoon at one o'clock, followed by services at St. Paul's Reformed church, with interment in St Paul's cemetery.
