Anna Katherine Schneider. Anna Katherine Pott was born Feb. 15, 1831, in Wunderthausen, Westphalia, Germany Coming to America in the earl 50's she was united in marriage to Franz Schneider at Easton, Pa, on August 3rd, 1854 For sever years they made their home at Belyidere, N.J., P where he was foreman in one of the big mines

They came to Wheatland in 1861, and settled down on the form southeast of Wheatland, where they lived a happy and peaceful hfe, rearing their children to the faith of the German Reformed church, which they joined on their arrival here and to which they were ever faithful

The husband died July 10, 1892, t and she made her home with her unmarried cluldren, remaining on the home farm until in February, 1909, h when she built a modern home in n town and moved here with her son Theodore

She was the mother of eight children, five sons and three daughters

Two sons, Albert and Louis, and one daughter, Katherine, have al-d ready gone to the Great Beyond 11 Surviving her are Mrs. Louise Schneider, I rank W, John, Mrs a Mary Knoche, and Theodore G , all p of whom live here, excepting Frank te W., who lives at Pierce, Neb All the surviving children were with d their mother during her last hours D on earth

She had been in poor health for fa some time, suffering from an incurable disease of the stomach, and since the first of the month her death has been hourly expected Death ocwe curred Monday morning at a little past five o'clock.

She was a woman of excellent character and dearly beloved by children aud friends, and her death brings deep regrets and sympathy from all who knew her

The funeral will be held from the p house this afternoon, with services h at the German Reformed church at k 2 o'clock. Published July 20, 1910 in the Wheatland Gazette

She was apparently known as Katherine. She came to the U.S. in July of 1852 and married Franz within a month. You assume the match had been made in advance. Some of her brothers stayed in New Jersey while one sister also came to Wheatland. Her death date was July 18, 1910.
