Obituary.

Ludwig Riedesel, one of the pioneer settlers of Iowa and an early settler of Carroll county died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Flora Beckman, at Wheatland last week. Mr. Riedesel was born in Germany in 1822, and came to America when he was a young man and settled first in Ohio. After a short residence in that state he moved to Olinton county, Iowa where he resided until 1881, at which time he moved to Carroll county. For the past few months Mr. Mr. Riedesel had made his home with his daughter, Mrs. Beckman.

Mrs. Riedesel died seventeen years ago and since that time Mr. Riedesel has made his home with his children, of whom there were eigh!: Louis A; John C. and Mrs. Henry Wetter of Carroll county; George of Guthrie county, Franz of Charter Oak, Mrs. Flora Beckman of Wheatland, and Phillip and Miss Susan of Laramie, Wyo.

The funeral services were held at the Presbyterian church in Glidden, and the remains were laid to rest in the Glidden cemetery.—Lanesboro Topic.
